- Amazing Machines of the Forest Products Industry (Choose VHS or DVD. 32 min. PI)** Close-up views of feller-bunchers, debarkers, trucks, stackers and more! Some very modern technology.
- Whistlepunks and Sliverpickers (Choose VHS or DVD. 30 min. PI)** Take a video field trip to the forest with big rigs, fast machines and the men and women who work with them.
- That's How We Build a House (Choose VHS or DVD. 27 min. PI. Closed Captioned.)** See a house built from the ground up. Watch surveyors, architects, carpenters, electricians, plumbers, bricklayers and others work!
- The Big Renovation (Choose VHS or DVD. 50 min. PI)** Get ready to build! Meet the architect, the contractor, and other workers. Go to the sawmill. You'll even learn about termites!
- HOUSE. A Child's Guide to the Origins of Everyday Stuff (Choose VHS or DVD. 9 min. PI)** A tree's story of growing in the woods, traveling to the mill and job site, and becoming part of a new house.
- Elwood Elk. (DVD. 12 min. PI)** Elwood and his friends teach about invasive species. Idaho Weed Awareness Campaign.
- Lenny the Lumberjack (Choose VHS or DVD. 50 min. I)** Lenny, a Canadian logger, takes you through a day of trees, big rigs, and thoughts about forest management.
- Billy B Sings About Trees (CD. PIJ)** Songs written and performed by Billy Brennan, who educates through music, dance and audience participation. All 19 songs integrate with Project Learning Tree activities.
- PLT Energy & Society Kit (Choose VHS or DVD. IJ)** Kit contains *Energy & Society* music CD and Dance Video or DVD, Project Learning Tree activities, and posters. Move your students from potential to kinetic energy while they learn!
- Forests and Paper Forever (CD-ROM. IJ)** Explore virtual forests, journey through the recycling process, try your hand (and brain) at forest products "concentration" and more.
- How Does a Tree Grow? (CD-ROM. IJ)** From Weyerhaeuser's Forest Learning Center at Mt. St. Helens. Interactive lessons about seed germination, photosynthesis and how a tree grows. A nice supplement to tree cookie studies.

- The Paper Trail (Choose VHS or DVD. 4 min. All ages.)** Overview of history of paper. (Also in Paper Making Kit)
- Modern Papermaking (Choose VHS or DVD. 4 min. All ages.)** An overview of the industrial paper making process. (Also included in Paper Making Lending Kit.)
- Recycling: Lost and Found (Choose VHS or DVD. 4 min. All ages.)** An overview of the industrial paper recycling process. (Also included in Paper Making Lending Kit.)
- Paper: The Movie (Choose VHS or DVD. 14 min. IJ)** Take a fun-filled look at paper's influence on society, past and present. (Also included in Paper Making Lending Kit.)
- Recycling CD (3 ½ min. IJH.)** An overview of paper recycling—how & why to do it, current stats, future aims.
- Splendid Trees: Idaho's Diverse Native and Urban Forests (Choose VHS or DVD. 18 min. IJH)** Geographic review of Idaho's forests. Features individual tree species, blending natural and human history.
- FORESTERS: Growing Forests for our Future (Choose VHS or DVD. 14 min. IJH)** From the Society of American Foresters. Get an inside view of modern forestry careers.
- The Miracle Resource (Choose VHS or DVD. 15 min. IJH)** What resource is renewable, recyclable, durable, biodegradable, energy efficient, versatile, non-toxic and beautiful? Learn all about it in this video.
- How Timber Works (DVD. 46 min. IJH)** From the Discovery Channel's *How Stuff Works*. Learn about trees, photosynthesis, wood, harvesting, super trees, plywood, and wood as fuel.
- The Land Where Miracles Grow (DVD. 7 min. IJHA)** Learn about Idaho's forested endowment lands—how they are managed by the Idaho Dept. of Lands, and how they support public education.
- The Last of the Log Drives (Choose VHS or DVD. 20 min. IJHA)** Go along on the last great log drive on the Clearwater River in 1971. First-hand view of life on the river during the 95-mile journey.
- The Man Who Planted Trees (Choose VHS or DVD. 30 min. IJHA)** A man plants and nurtures a forests. Uplifting story highlights the difference one person can make. *Academy Award winner.*
- TREE (Choose VHS or DVD. 28 min. IJHA. Closed Captioned.)** From the popular *Eyewitness* series. Amazing facts!
- Outdoor Idaho: Conflict on the Clearwater (Choose VHS or DVD. 30 min. IJHA)** Issues abound in the Clearwater National Forest. Hear from many of the players, and learn about a forest in transition.
- Outdoor Idaho: Fire Line (Choose VHS or DVD. 30 min. IJHA)** Spend time with the women and men who fight fires in Idaho's forests, and learn about fire's role in Idaho ecosystems.
- Outdoor Idaho: St. Joe River Country (Choose VHS or DVD. 30 min. IJHA)** Explore past and present landscapes and lifestyles in the St. Joe River area of northern Idaho.
- Outdoor Idaho: War of the Weeds (Choose VHS or DVD. 30 min. IJHA)** Idaho Public TV reports from the frontlines of Idaho's war with alien species.
- Outdoor Idaho: Wild Fire (DVD. 30 min. IJHA)** Idaho Public TV explores the changing face of wildfire in the West—drought, climate change, high intensity fires, wildland-urban interface and more.

Discovering a Forest Microcosm (VHS. 12 min. J) Explore the micro-critters who inhabit the forest floor, and travel inside a termite to be an eye-witness of wood digestion! *Includes Teacher Guide.*

Building Homes of Our Own (CD. Choose shorter game version, or complete CD. JH) Students collect information, solve problems and make real-world choices as “virtual” builders. *Includes Teacher Guide.*

The Dynamic Forest (Choose VHS or DVD. 20 min. JH) Fire, wind and insects impact and shape forests. Describes forest management options for working with these powerful forces of nature.

Inquiry at Hinkle Creek (DVD. 16 min. JH) The process of scientific inquiry is demonstrated through a study done on a pair of watersheds in Oregon. Potential effects of logging on water quality, and wildlife and fish habitat are examined.

Career Options for Women--Forestry (DVD. 30 min. JHA) Meet three women with forest-related careers: a helicopter pilot, a pulp mill dispatch attendant, and a forest technician. Co-workers and supervisors add to descriptions of each job.

Modern Marvels: Logging Tech (Choose VHS or DVD. 50 min. JHA) Up-close look at incredible tools that let modern loggers perform Bunyanesque tasks every day. Historical look at tool development. *From The History Channel.*

Modern Marvels: The Lumberyard (DVD. 50 min. JHA) Explore wood—from the humble 2 x 4 to engineered lumber and renewable materials. An exciting visual field trip! *From The History Channel.*

Burning Issues (Interactive. Choose DVD or CD-ROM. JH) Fire’s role in different ecosystems. Aspects of fire management including prescribed burning, wildland-urban interface, suppression, invasive species and wildlife habitat. New DVD version includes additional ecosystems and lessons.

Two Sides of Fire (Choose VHS or DVD. 15 min. JHA.) Examines fire’s “good” and “bad” sides in historic and present-day ecosystems.

Fire Wars (Choose VHS or DVD. 2 hours. JHA. Closed Captioned.) Join the front lines of America’s war on wildfire in this NOVA production. Much footage of Idaho fires in the summer of 2000. *Related activities on NOVA website.*

Wildfire: Feel the Heat (Choose VHS or DVD. 40 min. JHA) DISCOVERY production (shown at IMAX theaters) about firefighters and fire ecology. Lots of Idaho footage.

Forests Are The Lungs of the Earth (DVD. 7 min. JHA.) Representatives of universities and forestry agencies share views about the role of management in addressing forest health, fire and climate change. *Accompanying booklet.*

The Forest Factor (DVD. 19 min. HA) An Oregon group, Communities for Healthy Forests, provides this program about catastrophic fire, forest health, forest management and forests’ role in the global climate.

The Methuselah Tree (VHS. 60 min. JHA. Closed Captioned.) This film dramatizes the life cycle of the world’s oldest living thing, the bristlecone pine tree. From NOVA. *Related activities at NOVA website.*

Sandpoint: At the North End of the Long Bridge (Choose VHS or DVD. 2 hours. JHA) Traces over 100 years of northern Idaho history—American Indians, pioneers, miners, loggers, WWII, recreation, tourism.

Community of Choices (DVD. 30 min. JHA) Understand connections between community appearance, design and economic development. Trees are definitely part of the plan!

Vintage Forestry & Logging (DVD. 2 hours. JHA) Compilation of vintage films showing the logging industry in the early 1900s, the life of a Forest Service ranger, the process of going from tree to newspaper in the 1930s, etc.

Dangerous Missions: TIMBER! (VHS. 45 min. JHA) Spans the 200-year evolution of careers associated with the U.S. forest products industry. *From The History Channel.*

Timber! Empires of Industry (VHS. 46 min. JHA) Rare footage. A riveting look at one of the U.S.’s oldest industries and how it is preparing for the future. *From The History Channel. Teacher’s Guide at History Channel website.*

The Floodwood: Choices for a Working Forest (Interactive CD-ROM. JHA) Take a virtual trip to an Idaho State Forest. View 360° panoramas. Learn from real Idaho foresters!

Trees are the Answer (VHS. 30 min. JHA) Patrick Moore, co-founder of Greenpeace, provides insights into how forests work and how they play a pivotal role in solving many current environmental problems.

The Right Choice: Careers in the Forest Products Industry (Choose VHS or DVD. 12 min. JHA) Foresters, biologists, chemists, engineers, researchers, marketers, computer specialists: just a few of the highlighted careers.

***This is My Office (DVD. 8 min. JHA)** Fast-paced. Shows what it’s like to work in the forest. Segments include opportunity, expectations, technology, stewardship and rewards. From Pacific Forest Foundation.

The Greatest Good: A Forest Service Centennial Film (Choose VHS or DVD. 2 hours. JHA) High definition documentary of the agency’s first century—a uniquely American story. (Divided into 30-minute segments)

The Continuing Forest: Managing the Resources of our National Forests (VHS. 28.5 min. JHA) Overview of the challenges of managing local national forest land. Interesting historic footage.

Lakeface-Lamb Land Stewardship Project (Choose VHS or DVD. 21 min. HA. Closed Captioned.) The Priest Lake community uses a new approach to managing local national forest land. One of a few Stewardship Projects in the nation.

WILDFIRE: Preventing Home Ignitions (VHS. 19 min. HA) The combustion process, survivable space, why some homes survive, how to identify your home’s Ignition Zone. USFS Fire Sciences Lab research.

***Flume Logging: Priest Lake 1947, 1948, 1949. (DVD. 40 min. HA)** Original film by Ralph Morrow. Amazing historical footage provides a glimpse into the life of flume loggers. Mature audiences due to some “colorful” characters.

America’s Forests: A History of Resiliency and Recovery (Choose VHS or DVD. 23 min. HA) Follows U.S. forests from pre-European settlement to the present and our challenges for the future.

Community Forestry: Compendium of Resources (CD. HA) Idaho Dept. of Lands compiled this comprehensive CD of resource articles, education booklets, and scientific papers on the air, water, health, energy and economic benefits of trees.

Crystal Clear: Protecting Idaho's Watersheds (VHS. 12 min. HA) Learn how Idaho's water quality is protected with Best Management Practices and the "cumulative watershed effects" process.

Forest Wars (VHS. 50 min. HA) This documentary on the "forest wars" of the northwest covers past and present management, and the value systems that drive competing "sides" in the battle.

Forestry: An Intricate Balance (VHS. 12 min. HA) Portrays U.S. forest resources, the demands Americans place on forests, and the role of forestry in helping to balance those demands. Highlights careers.

It Takes a Tree (Choose VHS or DVD. 17.5 min. HA) Each of us uses the equivalent of a tree 100 feet tall and 18 inches in diameter each year. See what is done to protect the environment when *your* tree is cut.

I Want to Log "Selectively" (VHS. 40 min. HA) Considers forest ecology, tree growth, and genetics as factors in managing a private forest. Computer models. Great introduction to applied ecology.

Materials and the Environment (VHS. 15 min. HA) Looks at global economic and ecological consequences of using wood or substitute products to support expanding populations.

Idaho's Working Forests: Keeping the Miracle Useable, Renewable and Beautiful (DVD. 12 min. HA) Idaho's forests—who owns them, how they're managed, who works there, technology used, contribution to the economy, and more.

Outdoor Forest Classrooms (VHS. 10 min. A.) Take a trip to the James River Corporation outdoor forest classroom in Oldtown, Maine. Provides rationale for learning outside, and an example of how to set up an outdoor forest classroom.

Ponderay Newsprint Story (Choose VHS or DVD. 23 min. IJH) See the whole cycle of newsprint, from the starting points to the newspaper on the doorstep, and ultimately back to the recycling bin. Ponderay Newsprint is located in Usk, WA.+

Konkolville Lumber Company (VHS. 28 min. IJH) From humble beginnings in 1947, Konkolville, Idaho grew into a one-of-a-kind community. This 50th anniversary video showcases the interesting history of this family business empire.

Welcome to Potlatch (VHS. 10 min. IJH) Local students take you on a quick tour of Potlatch Corporation's Lewiston, Idaho operations, highlighting the sawmill, paper mill and seedling nursery.

The Forest Products Cycle (DVD. IJ) From the Forest Learning Center at Mt. St. Helens. Weyerhaeuser provides guided tours of 1) Harvest and Regeneration, 2) the Sawmill, and 3) Newsprint and Recycling.

Logs to Lumber: Inside a High-Tech Idaho Sawmill (DVD. 7.5 min. IJA.) Visit the Grangeville sawmill of Idaho Forest Group. You can almost smell the sawdust! (Replaces mid-90's *From Logs to Lumber.*)
