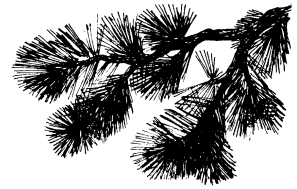

Arbor Day

QUESTION: Dying trees release _____ and absorb _____?
ANSWER: Dying trees produce carbon dioxide and use oxygen.

QUESTION: What is “Silviculture?” a) The mining and refining of silver
b) A heavy metal rock group c) The science of growing healthy forests.
ANSWER: C) The science of growing healthy forests.

QUESTION: What does the term “break up” mean to a logger?
ANSWER: It’s the late winter and spring when they must stay off wet, soft roads to protect water quality and road systems.

QUESTION: What do foresters measure with a clinometer?
ANSWER: The height of trees and the slope of hills and roads.

QUESTION: What does the term “cruise” mean to a forester?
ANSWER: To cruise is to measure the volume of trees on an acre of land.

QUESTION: Name the state law that protects Idaho’s forests.
ANSWER: The Idaho Forest Practices Act.

QUESTION: What does the abbreviation “BMP” stand for?
ANSWER: “Best Management Practices” - Guidelines used to direct forest activities and protect water quality.

QUESTION: How many trees are planted in the U.S. each year?
a) 1.5 million b) 150 million c) 1.5 billion d) 1 trillion
ANSWER: c) 1.5 billion seedlings are hand-planted in addition to what Nature plants.

QUESTION: What percentage of Idaho is covered by trees?
a) 15% b) 26% c) 42% d) 70%
ANSWER: 42% of the entire state is covered in trees (22.3 million acres).

QUESTION: What percentage of the earth's land surface is covered in forests?

a) 15% b) 30% c) 60% d) 80%

ANSWER: 30% of the earth's land surface is covered by forests.

QUESTION: What is a board foot?

ANSWER: A standard unit for measuring the volume of wood in trees, logs or lumber in North America. (For example, a piece of wood 1'x1'x1")

QUESTION: What are the dimensions of one "cord" of wood?

ANSWER: 8 feet wide, 4 feet deep and 4 feet high.

QUESTION: What is woody biomass?

ANSWER: stems, branches, small trees, twigs, residue from wood processing.

QUESTION: Why is woody biomass in the news?

ANSWER: Woody biomass can be used to make fuel.

QUESTION: How much wood does the average American use each year?

a) 500 pounds b) 1000 pounds c) over a ton d) over two tons

ANSWER: Over a ton of wood each year. Each year the average American uses over 43 cubic feet of wood and 681 pounds of paper or the equivalent of one 100-foot tall tree, 18 inches in diameter.

QUESTION: How much wood is in a typical 2,000 square foot single-family home?

ANSWER: 15,800 board feet of lumber and 10,900 square feet of paneling and other wood products.

QUESTION: How many products come from trees?

a) 500 b) 1,200 c) 3,000 d) over 5,000

ANSWER: Over 5,000 products come from trees.

QUESTION: Idaho sold approximately how many dollars worth of wood and paper products in 2007?

a) \$14 million b) \$140 million c) \$ 1.4 billion d) \$1.4 trillion

ANSWER: c) \$ 1.3 billion

QUESTION: Which of the following does not contain products that come from a tree: a) a toothpaste b) a football helmet c) artificial vanilla flavoring d) a twinkie e) vitamins

ANSWER: None - they all contain products that come from a tree.

QUESTION: Paper bags were first measured by how many pounds of (What commodity) it would hold?

ANSWER: Sugar (i.e., a 1 lb. bag was named that because it held 1 lb. of sugar)

QUESTION: How many Idaho jobs are tied to the forest?

a) 1,380 b) 3,180 c) 13,300 d) 31,800

ANSWER: d) There are 10,800 forest jobs and over 21,000 additional jobs in service and related businesses.

QUESTION: How does timber sales from Idaho state forests help public schools?

ANSWER: When Idaho became a state, the federal government gave our state forest land to fund public schools. Even today, revenue from timber sold on state forests is used to fund public schools and institutions.

QUESTION: True or false, paper can be recycled forever?

ANSWER: False, the fibers that make up paper break down each time it is recycled and eventually are unable to be used to make recycled paper.

QUESTION: More of which material is recovered in America for recycling than all other materials combined?

ANSWER: Paper

QUESTION: What percentage of all the paper Americans use is recovered through recycling? a) 22% b) 32% c) 52% d) 82%

ANSWER: c) 52%

QUESTION: Which of the following is strongest?

a) a pound of glass b) a pound of steel
c) a pound of wood d) a pound of concrete?

ANSWER: c) - Wood - Pound for pound, wood is the strongest!
